CELL PHONE POLICY

Students may bring their cell phones to school, but they must be powered off and put away as soon as they arrive on school property (schoolyard and school building). These and other Smart devices may only be used under the classroom teacher's direct supervision for learning.



WINTER DRESS & SCHOOL PRACTICE FOR OUTDOOR RECESS



We encourage all students to arrive at school each day dressed in a manner which will allow them to be outdoors for the regularly scheduled recess periods. Winter coats, appropriate footwear, and head and hand protection are all required by all students. Our school policy is to maintain regular outdoor recesses during the winter except when rain or severe cold would require alternative decisions (e.g., shortened/indoor recess).

Students are to have outdoor footwear, which is to be worn outdoors during recess and indoor footwear, which is to be worn during classroom time, need to come prepared to participate in all activities, including outdoor recess. Please ensure that your child is dressed appropriately for the forthcoming colder weather, including having hats, boots, and mittens/gloves.

INCLEMENT WEATHER PROTOCOL

If Environment Canada forecasts poor weather conditions (including ice, significant snowfall, poor visibility, or extreme cold temperatures), the Toronto Student Transportation Group (TSTG), the Toronto Catholic District School Board (TCDSB), and the Toronto District School Board (TDSB) teams will assess and monitor the situation overnight and into the early morning to determine any necessary bus cancellations.

PARENTS/GUARDIANS OF GRADE 4 STUDENTS

2023-2024 KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

Registration for the 2023-2024 school year opens on Wednesday January 25th at 10:00 am EST.

Children born in 2019 are eligible to attend Junior Kindergarten in **September 2023**. Registration will begin in **January 2023**. All required documents can be uploaded to the application electronically before meeting with the school. Pre-registration begins in **March**. The school will confirm your appointment to complete the registration. Final placement is subject to a meeting with the school.

Eligibility for Admission

The following original documents for your child are required upon registration:

- Birth certificate.
- Proof of Catholicity (one of the following documents):
 - * Your child's Catholic baptismal certificate.
 - * The parent's Catholic baptismal certificate (the Catholic parent must provide proof of residency in the City of Toronto).
 - * A letter of enrolment to the R.C.I.A./R.C.I.C. program.
- Passport/immigration documents (if the child was not born in Canada).
- Proof of address (two pieces required a rental/lease agreement, utility bills, and proof of purchase).

Parents of Toronto school-aged children must provide their child's vaccination information directly to Toronto Public Health. Visit **City of Toronto** for more details.
