# **CLASS PLACEMENT FOR SEPTEMBER 2024**

The process for staff allocation and class lists will soon be underway. The first step in this process is determining staffing allocation and the number of homeroom classrooms for Kindergarten to Grade 8, consistent with Ministry and contractual guidelines.

The school board will generate a tentative September model for our school based on the projected enrollment for the 2024-2025 academic year. Within the Ministry's parameters, classes may be reorganized in September 2024 with a change to enrolment.

We aim to establish balanced classes to provide effective working groups that benefit all children in each classroom. Teachers will meet to consider the following criteria carefully.

- Learning Styles
- Social Grouping
- English as a Second Language (ESL)
- Balance of males/females
- Academic Abilities
- Special Education Needs
- Behavioural Needs
- Siblings in the same class
- Previous placement in combined classes

#### NAVY BLUE AND WHITE DRESS CODE

A reminder that students are to wear the navy blue and white dress code. The dress code is expected for excursions and during gym classes. Inappropriate dress may not be worn, including spaghetti straps, racer-back tops, midriff revealing tops, short shorts, and biking shorts. Logos, sayings and pictures that address or display sexual content, substance abuse, violence, profanity, inappropriate references to nationality, race or gender, or articles of clothing in serious disrepair are not permitted.

For the remaining months of the school year, we will engage classes in a friendly competition on the compliance of the navy blue and white dress code for grades K-8. Mr. Agostino and Mr. Balik will visit classrooms to award 1 point to those classes that are in dress code compliance (every student in the classroom needs to be in dress code when visited) The class with the most points for Grades K-3, Grades 4-6, and Grades 7-8, at the end of each month will receive a pizza lunch courtesy of our CSPC.



### APPLICATION TO REGISTER FOR THE 2024-2025 SCHOOL YEAR

Applications for registration to schools in the Toronto Catholic District School Board can be made online on the Student Online Application for Registration (SOAR) at http://soar.tcdsb.org.

#### **Online Application**

Please complete the <u>form</u> if you expect your child to transfer to another school before the next school year commences in September 2024. Also, if you are planning an extended summer vacation, whereby your children will not return until after the first week of September 2024, please let us know as soon as possible.

Staffing and classroom organization are directly related to student enrolment. Therefore, we must have the most accurate information possible for next year.

#### SCHOOL SAFETY REMINDERS FOR VISITORS

To ensure the safety and efficiency of our school environment, we kindly ask for your support in adhering to the following procedures:

Main Entrance Protocol: For entry to the school premises, we request all visitors to use the main front doors and proceed directly to the office for assistance. Please note that teachers may be occupied with important tasks such as preparing materials, finalizing plans, participating in meetings, or working directly with students, and thus may not be available for unscheduled meetings without prior notice.



<u>Recess Visitation Policy</u>: To maintain a secure atmosphere during recess, we urge visitors to refrain from attempting to communicate with students or others at the school yard fence, or entering the school grounds during instructional hours. Activities along the fence can distract our staff members responsible for supervising students and may cause discomfort or unease among students. Furthermore, such behaviour could inadvertently signal potential threats that similar actions are permissible.

<u>Authorized Entry Times to the School Yard:</u> Parents and guardians are permitted to enter the schoolyard solely for the end-of-day dismissal time, starting at 3:00 p.m. During the hours of 8:15 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., only school staff members, including lunch supervisors and volunteers, are authorized to be present in the school yard.

<u>Student Pickup Guidelines</u>: If you need to pick up your child during school hours, we kindly request that you avoid doing so during recess periods (10:12 am to 10:27 am, 11:35 am to 12:15 pm, and 1:40 pm to 1:55 pm), as it may be challenging to locate and retrieve your child during these times. In such instances, parents will be asked to exercise patience and wait until the end of the recess period to collect their child.

Your cooperation in adhering to these guidelines is greatly appreciated as we work together to maintain a safe and supportive learning environment for all students. Should you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to contact the school office for further assistance.

Thank you to Mr. Agostino for his support, and to all the teachers who worked with their students to create one-of-a-kind art pieces.


