



#### **GRADE 8 GRADUATING CLASS OF 2024**



#### 2023-2024 CSPC IMPACT REPORT

Your Parent Council is pleased to share the CSPC 2023-24 Impact Report, which summarizes total funds raised, key investments in the school, total funds given back to those in need, and volunteer opportunities created to facilitate parent involvement.

Through fantastic fundraising events like Walkathon, the Spring Social and Fun Fair, we were able to raise more than \$70,000 this year. The generosity and support of the parent community is what made this possible. Thank you!

One of CSPC's key responsibilities is to ensure these funds are invested in a broad range of resources and initiatives, for the benefit of all students at Blessed Sacrament.

This year, we continued to invest heavily in classroom technology. We bolstered the school's commitment to STEM by investing in math resources and Scientists in the School. We funded classroom art and dance programs, and purchased new instruments for




the instrumental music program. We covered the cost of the Haudenosaunee Games and Introduction to Lacrosse, a unique and interactive indigenous cultural experience for students in grades 4-8. We funded busing for multiple athletic events, purchased new sports equipment for the Phys Ed program, and new outdoor sports equipment for primary students to use during recess. We invested in mental health and well-being initiatives such as student and parent presentations from internet safety expert Paul Davis. We provided a bursary program for BSCS families who may need assistance with school-related expenses. And we supported many fun events for students and parents alike such as the Halloween dance, Carnaval, and the Curriculum Night parent social.



#### ... 2023-24 CSPC IMPACT REPORT CONTINUED

We are fortunate enough to be able to support other communities in need. This year, we raised \$4,000 in grocery gift cards for needy schools in the GTA, and donated more than 3,000 pounds of food items, 12 bags of uniform items, and 300 winter warmth items. Together with school-led initiatives like Twoonies for Terry, ShareLife and the Angel Foundation for Learning, Blessed Sacrament gave back nearly \$15,000. The generosity of this parent community never ceases to amaze!



Finally, we always strive to create great opportunities for parents to get involved in school activities.

Thank you to the more than 145 parent volunteers who gave their time and energy to Kiss n' Ride, pizza lunch, Project Library, Walkathon, Fun Fair, the Spring Social and so many other important initiatives!

Your involvement is an important part of what makes this school community so special.

We'd like to thank parents who reached out to CSPC over the school year with their suggestions, questions and input. This important feedback helps us be responsive to the parent community and prioritize investments in a way that best meets the community's needs.



#### **BSCS OUTDOOR IMPROVEMENTS**

CSPC has been working on a number of initiatives to improve the outdoor recreational spaces at the school. We have reached out to the Board landscape architect to discuss rebuilding the existing butterfly garden to make it a cleaner, safer, more useable space. This is a large-scale project that would require significant time and resources. While we don't expect anything to happen in the short term, we've put this on the Board's radar and will continue to follow up in the hopes of getting the project completed over the next few years.



Every year, the TCDSB administers a playground revitalization fund that provides funds to schools that need outdoor recreational upgrades or improvements. The fund provides a maximum of \$125,000 per ward per year (elementary and secondary). We submitted an application to help fund the replacement of the upper playground for grades 1 and 2. We hope to hear back from the Board in the coming months as to whether our application is successful. But even if we don't receive funding from the Board, CSPC has been setting aside funds for the new playground for a number of years, and we plan to move forward regardless.

The existing playground was built 22 years ago and is well beyond the 10-15 year average lifespan of school play structures. It has been repaired countless times and requires extensive ongoing maintenance and repairs. A parent survey CSPC conducted in April 2022 revealed that 73.2% of parents support replacing the playground. Our plan is to create a new play structure that would include slides, monkey bars, activity panels and climbers, and either a rubberized safety surface or artificial turf for optimal safety. The new play structure and surface would offer a safe, fun, and inclusive recreational environment.

Finally, thanks to Mr. Agostino for reaching out to the Board and tracking down new bike racks for the school. Just in time for Bike to School week, new racks with space for 16 additional bikes were installed at no cost to the school.



#### **QUINN CAMMAERT MEMORIAL**

As many of you know, our school community lost grade 8 graduate Quinn Cammaert when she was tragically killed in a 2021 boating accident. To honour Quinn's memory, CSPC has been working closely with the Cammaert family to create a beautiful tribute to Quinn here at the school. Building on the ladybug garden created by Kindergarten students a few years ago, we will be installing a permanent structure in the garden adjacent to the front entrance of the school. We hope this structure will remind everyone of how special Quinn was and the positive impact she had on the school.



#### 3180 Yonge Street Condo Development - Update from CSPC

As many are aware, an 11-storey condo development has been approved at 3180 Yonge Street, adjacent to the school. Over many months, CSPC has been working closely with the TCDSB, City Planning Department, Concillor Mike Colle's office and the developer to voice our concerns about the impact the development will have on the health, safety and wellbeing of BSCS students and staff during demolition and construction. We've made significant progress in having those concerns addressed.

The project has been significantly delayed. According to our sources, the current developer is trying to sell the property to another developer. While we don't have any details, we do know there hasn't been any activity on the project for some time and nothing is planned for the immediate future. We will keep the parent community informed as new information becomes available.

#### YOUR OPPORTUNITY TO MAKE AN IMPACT



At the end of this school year, several CSPC members will be stepping down. Some members have served on parent council for many years, and it's time to create opportunities for others to contribute their ideas, their energy, and their leadership. It's also important that parents of kids in younger grades have the opportunity to join CSPC, as their perspective is unique and important, and they can contribute over the long term. There will be 5 spots available. If you've ever thought about joining CSPC, this is a great time to get on board and make an impact.

Joining parent council is easy. You can nominate yourself, or someone else can nominate you by completing a half-page nomination form. No prior experience necessary! Elections for the 2024/2025 school year will be held in October.
