

On Monday, February 26, we will welcome Paul Davis to the school. Paul Davis is a renowned internet and social media safety expert. He has presented to nearly 1 million students and parents across Canada and the US on topics such as online security, digital trails, social media safety, and more. He has presented at dozens of conferences and appeared in countless media interviews.

His presentations are targeted so that audience members leave with a wealth of knowledge and empowerment for their respective age level. We hosted him in 2021. We're delighted to have him back again this year in response to requests from the parent community. He will be providing two student sessions during the



day: a session for grades 4 to 6 as well as a session for grades 7 and 8. Both sessions will include time for Q&A.

Kiss 'N Ride:


The morning drop-off program that keeps our kids safe.
