Lunchroom Supervisors Needed

WINTER ATTIRE AND OUTDOOR RECESS GUIDELINES

We urge students to come to school daily dressed appropriately for outdoor activities, especially during the regularly scheduled recess periods. All students must wear winter coats, suitable footwear, as well as head and hand protection. Our school policy advocates for regular outdoor recesses in winter, with exceptions made in cases of rain or severe cold, leading to alternative decisions such as shortened or indoor recess.

Students are required to have outdoor footwear for recess, to be worn only outdoors, and indoor footwear for classroom time.









If Environment Canada forecasts poor weather conditions (including ice, significant snowfall, poor visibility, or extreme cold temperatures), the Toronto Student Transportation Group (TSTG), the Toronto Catholic District School Board (TCDSB), and the Toronto District School Board (TDSB) teams will assess and monitor the situation overnight and into the early morning to determine any necessary bus cancellations.

This decision will be made by 6:00 AM.

EXTENDED FRENCH EVENING INFORMATION SESSION FOR PARENTS/GUARDIANS OF GRADE 4 STUDENTS



Blessed Sacrament offers the Extended French program from Grades 5 to 8. Students learn French as a subject, and French serves as the language of instruction in social studies, history, geography, physical education, health and visual arts. Instruction is provided in French for approximately 50% of the total instructional time until Grade 8 graduation.

In February, an in-person information presentation will be provided to interested parents and students currently in grade 4. The date will be shared with parents once it is confirmed.



KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION FOR THE 2024-2025 SCHOOL YEAR

Children born in 2020 are eligible to attend Junior Kindergarten in September 2024. Registration for the 2024-2025 school year will start on January 24th, 2024, at 10:00 am EST. Final placement is subject to a meeting with the school. All required documents must be uploaded to the application electronically before meeting with the school. Pre-registration begins in March. The school will confirm your appointment to complete the registration. Final placement is subject to a meeting with the school.

Children born in 2020 are eligible to attend Junior Kindergarten in September 2024.
