MARCH VIRTUE OF THE MONTH: FORGIVENESS

Criteria for the Virtue of Forgiveness Award

- students who demonstrate acceptance of others, their ideas and differences
- students who express sincere apology or remorse for their actions
- students who resist judging others
- students who are open and seek remediation for conflicts
- students who are willing to repair damaged relationship



TCDSB N-WORD PROTOCOL

Background:

The TCDSB Equity Action Plan specifically aims to address all derogatory slurs. This protocol addresses the use of the N-word. It has been developed in consultation with staff, students, and parents, including a discussion with the TCDSB African Canadian Advisory Committee.

The N-word is rooted in hatred and oppression. It came from a time when enslavers used the word to demean, humiliate, and control African people. It is sometimes still used in this way today. There has been a move since the 1980s among some Black people to reclaim the power of the word, and that is why you may hear some Black people use the word.

It is important to note that the use of the N-word still causes trauma to many individuals in our school communities.

For these reasons, the TCDSB is clear in its direction.

The N-word is not to be used in TCDSB schools. This includes written or spoken form. Classroom instruction and pedagogy should help to instill this point in all members of the TCDSB community.




Progressive discipline and restorative practices will be followed in instances where the N-word is used. Hateful use of the N-word will not be tolerated.



ACCESS TO THE SCHOOL PREMISES

Only students and staff are permitted in the schoolyard in the morning. If you wish to speak with the school administration or teachers before the beginning of the school day, please visit the office through the front door. Only staff and parents who have signed in at the office are permitted in the hallway and classrooms. At the 3:00 pm dismissal, parents are permitted in the yard to pick up children. Teachers accompany students to the yard at the end of the day for safe dismissal.

World Day of Prayer (WDP) is traditionally observed on the first Friday of March, though communities can choose other dates. This year, World Day of Prayer is on March 1, 2024.

World Day of Prayer is a global ecumenical movement which brings Christians of many traditions together to observe a common day of prayer each year. Countries are encouraged to come together in spirit, unite on a common day, and pray for relevant issues affecting women and children.

STREET PROOFING STRATEGIES

Remind children of these safety guidelines to reinforce with children in case they encounter a situation involving a stranger:

- 1. Encourage children to trust their instincts and assert their boundaries by emphasizing their right to say "NO," even to adults.
- 2. Remind them not to accept rides, gifts, treats, or money from strangers.
- 3. Ensure they are familiar with their full name, address, phone number, and how to reach their parents or dial 911 in case of emergencies.
- 4. If they notice someone following them on foot or in a vehicle, advise them to loudly call for assistance and quickly move away from the situation.
- 5. Teach them to decline any requests for help from adults, such as assisting in finding a lost pet, and instead prompt them to refuse politely and inform their parents or another trusted adult. It's crucial to emphasize that adults should never seek help from children in such circumstances.

On Monday, February 26, we welcomed Paul Davis to the school. Paul Davis is a renowned internet and social media safety expert. He has presented to nearly 1 million students and parents across Canada and the US on topics such as online security, digital trails, social media safety, sexting and more. He has presented at dozens of conferences and appeared in countless media interviews. We last invited him to Blessed Sacrament in 2021, and we were delighted to have him back again this year in response to requests from the parent community. He provided two student sessions during the day: one for grades 4-6 and one for grades 7 and 8. He also provided a parent session at 6:30pm that evening, which more than 60 parents attended. 


BSCS FUN FAIR 2024
