

FOOD ALLERGIES - BIRTHDAYS & CELEBRATIONS

Food items that contain nuts, peanuts, peanut by-products, and peanut oil may not be brought to school. Please refrain from bringing such products into the school.

Additionally, we kindly request that you do not send food treats for birthdays or other celebrations throughout the year. Instead, consider alternatives like small toys, pencils, stickers, crayons, a modest loot bag (containing 1 or 2 items), or party hats.



COLD WEATHER & APPROPRIATE ATTIRE



To ensure that students can fully participate in all activities, including outdoor recess, it's crucial that they come prepared for colder weather.

Please make sure your child is appropriately dressed, including wearing hats, boots, and mittens/gloves.



INDOOR FOOTWEAR



We ask that all students have a designated pair of indoor shoes to help minimize the amount of dirt and mud brought inside. Students cannot go barefoot, wear only socks, or use sandals/crocs within the school premises for safety reasons. Closed shoes are required.
