SIGN IN AT THE OFFICE

To ensure student safety, all volunteers, parents and visitors must report to the office upon entering the school. Please sign in / out at the office if you are picking up or dropping off items for your child. Please avoid visiting the school or picking up your child during recesses.

CELL PHONE POLICY

Students are allowed to bring their cell phones to school; however, it is imperative that these devices are powered off and stowed away immediately upon entering school property, including the schoolyard and the school building. The utilization of cell phones and other smart devices is restricted to instances when students are under the direct supervision of their classroom teacher for educational purposes.

STUDENTS LEAVING SCHOOL PROPERTY DURING THE SCHOOL DAY

For safety, students may only leave school property during the school day (8:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.) with their parent/

guardian. Students will not be released to other parents/ guardians to go out for lunch or appointments. In extenuating circumstances, please notify the school's main office when another person will pick up your child for dismissal (and is not returning to the school). Grade 8 students need to return permission forms to go out for lunch on Fridays only.

If you are picking up your child early from school, please avoid arriving during recesses (10:12-10:27; 11:35-12:15, 1:40-1:55) when students are in the schoolyard. Always visit the school office first. Please arrive no later than 2:30 p.m. to pick up your child for early dismissal.



SCHOOL DRESS CODE

The school dress code is solid white and navy blue. We encourage students to wear collared shirts during special events (school masses, assemblies, etc.). Please review the school dress code on the school website for more information: www.blessedsacramentcs.com/dress-code

The TCDSB-appropriate dress code is always in effect and includes (but is not limited to) no spaghetti straps, race-back tops, midriff revealing tops, short-shorts, and biking shorts. Logos/comments/pictures that address or display sexual content, substance abuse, violence, profanity, inappropriate references to nationality, race or gender, or articles of clothing in serious disrepair are not permitted.

STUDENT WASHROOMS

We strive to keep our physical and learning environment safe and welcoming for all students, staff, parents and community partners. To keep Blessed Sacrament a respectful environment, students must report incidences of vandalism to the office. Incidences will be dealt with when brought to our attention on an individual needs basis.



BUS TRANSPORTATION



Busing is a service provided by the School Board. As with any service, specific expectations are conditional to use. We remind parents of the following:

- Students registered for the bus are expected to use the service every day they are scheduled to take it. It is not a student's decision to walk some days and take the bus on other days.
- Students registered for a school bus and failing to use the service regularly will lose their school bus privileges.
- Students can only use the registered bus route and stop.
- If your child does not take the bus on a specific day, please provide the school office and the child's teacher with a written note advising of the transportation change. **Unfortunately, we cannot accept telephone calls related to bus changes to the office.**

Local conditions may impact the timely running of school buses. You are encouraged to sign up for the transportation portal to ensure you have access to the latest transportation information. The transportation portal will provide more reliability and functionality, including bus delays, cancellations, and GPS data to confirm bus locations. Parents can sign up online to access the portal via the new BusPlanner portal: https://busplannerweb.torontoschoolbus.org/ to set up an account and get access. You will need your child's transportation information and the 9-digit OEN (found on their report card) to access this information.

For those families who are not in our school's bus catchment area who have applied under the empty seat or exceptional circumstance criteria for this academic year, please keep in mind that approval of busing under these criteria does not mean that transportation will be provided as it is dependent on seat availability and sufficient time for the vehicle to perform its route. All empty seat/extenuating circumstance requests must be submitted each year the bus service is requested under these criteria.

Your cooperation with these guidelines is appreciated. Feel free to contact the school if you have any questions.

Investment Priorities

One of CSPC's key priorities is investing in a broad range of resources and programs for the benefit of all students at Blessed Sacrament. Planning for our annual budget starts long before the new school year begins. The Principal works closely with teachers to determine what their classroom needs are, and he identifies broader school needs in alignment with the Board priorities of learning, equity and well-being. We also survey parents every few years to gauge feedback on budget priorities and areas for future investments.

Based on the Principal's wish list and the April 2022 parent survey results, CSPC's investment priorities are:

- Technology in the classroom
- Curriculum resources to support math and literacy in the classroom
- STEM initiatives
- Mental health and well-being initiatives

Every year, we also offer a bursary for Blessed Sacrament families who may need assistance with school-related expenses. Requests can be made in full confidentiality directly to Mr. Agostino.

On a final finance note, we are looking for a parent to support our amazing Treasurer Sara. Ideally, we're looking for an accountant or someone with an accounting background who is fluent in Excel and QuickBooks to support Sara with CSPC finances. It's not a significant time commitment – just 1-2 hours per week. Please reach out to us or Mr. Agostino if you're interested.

Playground Fundraising

We are excited to announce that, in January 2024, we will be kicking off a fundraising campaign to replace the upper playground structure and softscape!

The current structure shows the wear and tear of many years of fun play by students and neighbourhood children alike. Unfortunately, TCDSB does not fund the replacement of aging school playgrounds. Once a play structure is deemed unsafe, the Board will cordon it off, leaving it unusable by any children. We are experienced in working with our wonderful parent community to ensure that does not occur! We will be sharing more information about our fundraising goals and plans in the months to come. KISS 'N RIDE PROGRAM

Our school is blessed to have a morning drop-off program that allows for the safe and convenient arrival of all students who are driven to school. It is run and staffed entirely by parent volunteers. There is ONE drop-off location for all students. It is located between the kindergarten yard and the school bus zone on the north side of Bedford Park Avenue.



Volunteers will be easily identifiable as they will be wearing yellow safety vests.

Kids should NOT be dropped off in the school bus zone, at the crosswalk or by the turf. Please do not park on the south side of Bedford Park Avenue.

For their safety and your peace of mind, students in JK and SK will be walked to the Kindergarten playground and delivered to a teacher. (They will be escorted directly to the JK/SK door in inclement weather). Children in Grade 1 will be accompanied to the main steps and directed to the west playground. All other students will enter the school area on their own.

Parents and caregivers are always asked to use your signal to indicate that you are queuing for the program. A volunteer will assist your child(ren) out of the vehicle on the street's curbside and escort them directly into the school as outlined above. Please DO NOT exit your vehicle. We ask that all backpacks and other belongings are already with your child, not in the trunk.

Drop-off begins at 8:15 am and ends at 8:30 am. Please do not arrive before 8:15 as there is no supervision. Students will need to enter the front door after 8:30 and report to the school office for an admit slip.

To keep this important service running, we need 3 volunteers each morning. Please sign up through SignUp Genius on the Blessed Sacrament school website: www.blessedsacramentcs.com and click "Volunteer to Help."
