## NATIONAL DAY FOR TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION



SEPTEMBER 30

Observed annually on **Tuesday, September 30**, the **National Day for Truth and Reconciliation** honors the survivors and victims of residential schools. The day was inspired by [Phyllis Webstad's story](#), in which her new orange shirt was taken away on her first day at the St. Joseph Mission Residential School in Williams Lake, B.C. This day serves as a powerful reminder to continue the conversation about the lasting impact of residential schools and to support truth, healing, and reconciliation across Canada.

To commemorate this day, students are encouraged to wear an orange shirt.



## STUDENT SAFETY AND SCHOOL ACCESS PROCEDURES

At Blessed Sacrament Catholic School, the safety and well-being of our students remain our highest priority. We are grateful for the continued partnership and support of our parents in fostering a safe and welcoming school environment.

To help reduce hallway congestion, minimize classroom disruptions, and ensure only authorized individuals are on school premises, we kindly ask that all families follow these important safety procedures:

- All parents and visitors must report to the main office upon arrival.
- Students should arrive in the schoolyard by 8:30 a.m.
- Parents/guardians are not permitted in the schoolyard during morning drop-off.
- Parents/guardians may enter the schoolyard at 3:00 p.m. for student pick-up.
- If dropping off your child after the school day has started, please accompany them to the office.
- If picking up your child before dismissal, please report to the office.
- For safety reasons, do not walk through the parking lot to access the schoolyard. Please use the designated entrances on Bedford Park Avenue.
- During school hours, only Blessed Sacrament students and staff are permitted in the schoolyard. This allows supervising staff to quickly identify any unauthorized individuals.

### SIGN IN AT THE OFFICE

To ensure student safety, **all volunteers, parents and visitors** must report to the office upon entering the school. Please sign in / out at the office if you are picking up or dropping off items for your child. **Please avoid visiting the school or picking up your child during recesses and after 2:30 p.m.**

### SCHOOL MESSENGER APPLICATION: SAFE ARRIVAL

The Safe Arrival system is used to report a student's absence or to schedule a student's late arrival or early departure from school. **As per the TCDSB's protocol for signing out students, a parent must visit the school office prior to a student leaving the school.**

## BUS TRANSPORTATION

The Toronto Catholic District School Board (TCDSB) works with the Toronto Student Transportation Group (TSTG) to provide transportation for qualifying children.

### School Bus Eligibility

Transportation is available for students who meet the following criteria:

- Distance: Students in Junior Kindergarten to Grade 8 who live more than 1.5 km from their school and are within the designated catchment area.
- Special Needs: Home pick up for any student not attending their local school.
- Hazards/Board Approved Areas: Students living in specific geographical areas identified by the board will have access to neighborhood bus stops.

## INCLEMENT WEATHER PROTOCOL

### Weather-Related Cancellations

In cases of severe weather, student transportation, classes, or programs may be cancelled. In rare instances, schools or administrative offices may also close. These decisions affect many families and are made with care. When Environment Canada forecasts poor conditions (e.g., ice, heavy snow, low visibility, or extreme cold), the Toronto Student Transportation Group (TSTG) and TCDSB monitor the situation overnight. **A decision on bus cancellations is typically made by 6:00 a.m.**

## KEEPING OUR STUDENTS SAFE

### ADMINISTRATION OF MEDICATION

To ensure student safety, prescription medication can only be administered during the school day with **written and signed authorization** from both the **parent/guardian** and the **prescribing physician**. Please make sure all medical forms are **current and complete**.

Please note: **Teachers are not permitted to administer non-prescription (over-the-counter) medications** to students.

### A REMINDER ABOUT FOOD ALLERGIES

Some students at Blessed Sacrament live with **severe, life-threatening food allergies (anaphylaxis)**, particularly to **nut products and other common food items**. Ensuring their safety is a **shared responsibility**, and we kindly ask all families to help by keeping **student lunches and snacks completely nut-free**.

### FOOD ALLERGIES—BIRTHDAYS AND CELEBRATIONS

Food Products that contain nuts, peanuts, peanut by-products, and peanut oil may not be brought into the school (they will not be distributed and will be returned home). Furthermore, please do not send in any food treats throughout the year on birthdays and/or for other celebrations. Alternatives to food items include a small toy item, pencil, stickers, crayons, a small loot bag (1 or 2 items) or party hats.

## PIZZA LUNCH RETURNS IN OCTOBER

Pizza Lunch will begin in October (exact start date to be confirmed) and will be served every Monday, except on holidays when it will be offered on Tuesday. Pizza Nova will be the provider, offering cheese and pepperoni slices.

**How do I order and pay?** Parents will be asked to pay a one-time fee for pizza lunch for the entire year. Ordering will be available through school cash online in the coming weeks.

**Can I volunteer to help?** Yes! Parents will have an opportunity to volunteer to distribute pizza in class rooms. Volunteers will be needed every week for all grades ELP-Gr. 8. Volunteer spots will be available on Signup Genius in a few weeks.

## DEVICE USE POLICY

The Ministry of Education released new direction affecting the use of electronic devices and access to social media at school. The new [Device Use policy](#) outlines expectations for school community members regarding the use of any electronic device during the school day, which includes:

- Students in Kindergarten to Grade 12 must ensure their devices are switched off or set to a silent mode and stored out of view during the school day/during instructional time (Exceptions are outlined in the policy and school discretion is considered).
- If a student is using a device during the school day/instructional time, the educator will instruct the student to put the device out of sight. If the student fails to comply with the direction, the student will be sent to the principal's office.
- When principals are addressing a student who fails to comply with an educator's direction to place a device out of sight, the principal will exercise their discretion and consider a range of responses to address the student's behaviour in alignment with the TCDSB's [Progressive Discipline policy](#).
- Parents/Guardians are encouraged to discuss this policy with their children.
- Social media platforms are restricted on school networks and school devices.



## SCHOOL CASH ONLINE

School Cash Online is a convenient and safe way for parents and guardians to pay for school materials and activities, including class trips, pizza lunches, agendas, yearbooks, and more.

Any parent and guardian with a child currently enrolled in a Toronto Catholic District School Board (TCDSB) school can create an account on SchoolCash Online and pay for school materials and activities offered by the school.

To register, go to <https://tcdsb.schoolcashionline.com> and follow the instructions. Once you have registered, you can then add your child to your account and receive emails and updates on available materials and activities.

## LOST AND FOUND REMINDER

To help recover lost items, please label your child's belongings—clothing, boots, gloves, lunch kits, shoes, etc. with their name. Check the Lost and Found box located in the school's basement regularly.

## BSCS STUDENT ACHIEVES RARE PERFECT SCORE IN PRESTIGIOUS GAUSS MATH CONTEST

Thirteen-year-old Declan O., a student at Blessed Sacrament Catholic School, has earned a perfect score of 150 in the Gauss Mathematics Contest, an extraordinary achievement that places him among the very top math students in the country.

The contest, organized by the Centre for Education in Mathematics and Computing (CEMC) at the University of Waterloo, attracted 76,524 participants worldwide in 2025. Fewer than 0.5 per cent of students achieved a flawless score, and only 2.5 per cent of Grade 7 students scored between 136 and 150, underscoring the challenge Declan mastered.

"When I found out I got a perfect mark, I was so happy, and a little surprised, because I wasn't completely sure about the last question," Declan said.

The Gauss contest is open to Grade 7 and 8 students in Canada and internationally. Students face 25 multiple-choice questions that cover algebra, geometry, patterning, data management, and measurement. Questions progress from straightforward to highly complex, testing not just knowledge but also problem-solving ability.

While contest results do not count toward a student's school grade, they provide a unique opportunity for young learners to challenge themselves. Declan, who has always loved math, embraced the experience with enthusiasm.

The average score on this year's Grade 7 Gauss contest was 88.3, making Declan's accomplishment all the more remarkable. The CEMC runs several contests designed to spark and nurture student interest in mathematics and computer science.

With this achievement, Declan joins an elite group of students who have demonstrated not only talent but also persistence and passion for problem-solving. His success is a promising sign of a bright future in mathematics.
